Georg Borges is a Professor of Civil Law, Legal Informatics, German and International Business Law and Legal Theory and the managing director of the Institute for Legal Informatics at the Saarland University.

Georg Borges studied law at the University of Frankfurt/Main, the University of Geneva and the University of Bonn as well as economics at the Fernuniversität Hagen. During his studies, he worked for a Tax Law Firm and achieved the status of a tax law assistant. After his graduation, Georg Borges was employed in a law firm and as a researcher at the University of Cologne before he was promoted to professor in 2004. From 2004 to 2014, he was Professor of Law at Ruhr-University Bochum. Beside this, he was also a Judge at the State Court of Appeals, Hamm Circuit.

As an expert on Business Law with a focus on Banking Law and IT Law, Prof. Borges authored several statements on behalf of the German Federal Ministry of Interior Affairs and the German Federal Office for Information Security. He is leading the pilot-project "data protection certification of cloud servicese" of the German Ministry of Economics and Energy and is co-editor, together with Jan Geert Meents, of a handbook on cloud computing.

His current research is related to cloud computing, German and European data protection law, internet of things and autonomous systems with a special focus on liability. Georg Borges is a well respected expert, especially in IT Law, with a wide range of interests.
